Fun Ways to Use QR Codes - by Kim Broadbent

Provo School District

- Place the QR code on a physical object with instructions for use (sports equipment, art supplies, lab equipment)
- Show a QR code on your TV as students walk in that links to an overview video or a video of an expert telling more about a class subject.
- On a unit vocabulary list, place QR codes next to words that link to an audio recording of a native speaker saying the word, using it in a sentence or telling more about it.
- Place QR codes on the inside cover of books that link to a video of the author reading an excerpt of the book or to a review or a movie trailer. (Give students the assignment of creating these for a few books each semester to help their learning and enriching your library.)
- QR Treasure Hunts - correct answers lead in the right direction.
